



A Death in Vienna

(Finalist for the 2005 Ellis Peters Historical Dagger) In the Vienna of Freud, Klimt, and Mahler, Max Liebermann practices the controversial new therapy of psychoanalysis with the skill of a master detective. In this debut mystery of the series (published in Britain as *Mortal Mischief*), Detective Oskar Rheinhardt calls on his friend Max for assistance after a psychic medium dies under extraordinary circumstances. Her body was found in a room that can only be locked from the inside; she seems to have been shot, but there's no gun and no trace of a bullet. On a table lies a suicide note, claiming that there is "such a thing as forbidden knowledge." All signs point to a supernatural killer, but the rational Liebermann is not so easily convinced. Frank Tallis, himself a clinical psychologist as well as a writer of first-rate literate suspense, whisks us back to Europe at the turn of the 20th century, when new theories about the workings of the mind are taking shape, and scientific methods of investigation are employed under flickering gaslight. 471.
